

What is a Pass?

A “pass” refers to a mobile friendly, digital “passport” program that you download onto your phone. When you arrive at each work you will “check-in” via GPS on your phone or mobile device

Where Can you Download a Pass?

Scan the QR code below to download your pass. Your pass will be emailed or sent via text and you are all set! The pass is added directly to your home screen

Do You Need to Pay for a Pass?

Nope! This is a free program to download

Does a Pass Expire?

The pass can only be redeemed and / or collected during the specified program duration of April 11th, 2026 through May 31st, 2026. Thereafter the pass is no longer able to be redeemed

What Qualifies as a Check-In?

A check-in is when a participant clicks the “check-in” button when they arrive at each unique work. You must be within 0.25 miles of the work’s location to check-in

Can you Check-in at the same work More than Once?

You can only check-in once per individual work

Can a Pass be Shared?

Only one user can use each pass. It cannot be shared amongst multiple users

Do You need to Download Your Pass Before Visiting the Trail?

You can download your pass at any time during the exhibition

Do All Check-ins Need to be Completed in a Single Day?

Check-ins can be completed at any time, during each businesses operational hours, April 11th, 2026 through Mat 31st, 2026

How does the points system and contesting work?

Each check-in, at each work, is assigned a points value of 100 points. Users collect points as they work to complete the pass. Each 1,000 points collected can be exchanged for one (1x) entry to a random draw to win one of 5 (five) \$100.00 Downtown Gift Cards, redeemable at over 85 businesses in Burlington Downtown. A user can have a max of one (1x) entry, which will be recorded in the pass itself. Points can no longer be exchanged for entries after the pass ends on May 31st, 2026. Winners will be contacted via the email used to sign up for the pass. Gift cards can either be mailed out or held for in-person pick-up
